Greetings from the West, Brethren;

At our recent long-range planning meeting one of our officers said that he thought Friendship was still struggling to define who we are and what we do. I disagree. I think we know very well who we are, but for the sake of our high aspirations and powerful imaginations we unnecessarily fret that who and what Friendship is isn't "good enough". I disagree with that, too. I think we just haven't figured out how to say it clearly for the uninitiated, in a way they can understand; and in a way that communicates the immeasurable value of what we offer. I'm optimistic that now that we have gained full control of our marketing platforms we will soon distill our message – because it is very clear to me who and what Friendship 160 is.

Our meetings focus on creating a sanctuary where everyone is welcome to speak, study and learn. We work together to grow our own knowledge as well as our Brothers' and build a common, unalienating idea of what it is to be a better man. We do this through work, fellowship and service; enjoying games, drinks and more conversation; while also seeking to serve our community through needed (though unglamorous) outreach. For two years we have partnered with Portland Public Schools to alleviate specific needs for specific schools; and in 2018 we began a homeless relief project, where we provide urban-outdoor survival kits to shelters and individuals. In so doing we have spared at least 300 people from the unrelenting ravages of Portland's winters – at a time when I have read in the newspaper not one month ago that Portland's *one* family shelter has had to start wait-listing families; and that this list is already some 39 *families* deep. Furthermore, Friendship has continued the legacy of social justice started by WB Jack Armstrong, and stands out as the sole Oregon Lodge to partner with the Grand Lodge to help guarantee the dignity and

safety of our homosexual Brothers - present and future. And all of this we have accomplished with progressively more conservative budgets and wise management of our patrimony year over year. It's crystal clear to me: Friendship Lodge is a tight-knit group of men who sincerely love each other and genuinely like spending their time together. We are committed to education (for ourselves, each other, and all of society), we express our mutual affections through hearty fellowship, mutual respect, service, and relief; and have shown a clear commitment to the ideals of social justice and moral progress. And while we keep one eye on the future, we carefully train the other on our past - continuing to honor and include our experienced, elder Brothers while not alienating our newer members (at a time when I see some Lodges notably choosing one over the other). I look at this record and the legacy it seeks to honor, and I am delighted to be a part of Friendship 160; and there is no other Lodge I can imagine calling *home*.

Thank you for your time and consideration, Brethren. I Look forward to seeing you again in December and the years beyond.
