As of the April 2022 Stated Communication, the Lodge has \$2,102,330.72 invested with Edward Jones, and as of this writing, a week before the May Stated Communication. has expended 19.95% of the 2022 budget. The mortgage of the Kenton Masonic Temple is currently valued at \$201,303.17. Of note this month is the fact that we have exceeded our anticipated Printing and Postage budget line item. \$1,200 was budgeted for this year, but the Lodge has so far expended almost \$1,400 on these expenses. This budget line is for the Secretary's duties in printing and mailing all of the trestleboards each month.
